

SINGAPORE BORDER CONTROL MEASURES

For Singapore Residents and Long-term Pass Holders

As the global situation improves with countries/places at various stages of putting in place effective systems to control the COVID-19 infection, Singapore will implement progressive changes as we re-open to international travel. More information on Singapore's border control measures and public health requirements can be found at the [SafeTravel website](#).

Singaporeans and residents of Singapore may travel overseas:

- To Australia (excluding Victoria State), Brunei, New Zealand and Vietnam for essential travel for business, official and work purposes under Green/Fast Lane arrangements and the Periodic Commuting Arrangement.

Except for the above, **Singapore residents are advised to defer all other forms of travel overseas. Travellers are advised to check the entry requirements imposed by the countries/regions they intend to travel to.**

A new travel bubble between Singapore and Hong Kong for leisure travel has been agreed in principal and will be implemented in the coming weeks. Singapore now has reciprocal green lane arrangements for essential business and official travel with China, Malaysia, Brunei, South Korea and Japan.



Malaysia Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 34,173

Recovered cases 23,120

Deaths 253

- Recovery Movement Control Order (RMCO) Has been extended to 31 Dec by the Malaysian Prime Minister.
- New Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO) has been extended in Kuala Lumpur, Putrajaya and Selangor for two more weeks until 9 Nov 2020.
- From 10 Aug, Long-term pass holders and those on essential or official business will be allowed to enter Malaysia after taking Covid-19 swab tests and allowed to stay for 3 months before returning.
- Singaporeans and other tourists are not allowed to enter Malaysia on a social visit pass during the RMCO period.
- Flights between Singapore and Malaysia have been available from July. These flight support Malaysians and Singaporeans who are PRs, have Long Term Work pass or are approved to travel under the Green Lane.

Indonesia Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 417,618

Recovered 346,000

Deaths 14,145


- COVID-19 risk in Indonesia is high. CDC recommends travelers avoid all nonessential international travel to Indonesia.
- Indonesia will continue not to open its doors to foreign tourists until a new coronavirus vaccine is found and immunity can be provided, a government official said
- Only personnel with special permission such as those working on national strategic projects, are allowed to enter.
- There are limited flights between Singapore and Indonesia currently
- Jakarta plans to re-impose a partial lockdown in most of the city due to escalation in Covid infections, while public transport hours will be restricted.

Philippines Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 387,287

Recovered 349,000

Deaths 7,300

- Even as quarantine restrictions are progressively lifted in the Philippines, localised lockdowns may be implemented in specific areas on short notice depending on the local COVID-19 situation.
- Metro Manila in Luzon and a few cities in Visayas and Mindanao remain under general quarantine restrictions with more businesses and public transport allowed to partially operate on condition people wear face masks and shields and stay safely apart.
- Foreign nationals permitted to enter must secure a pre-booked accredited quarantine facility and a pre-booked COVID-19 testing provider. They must cover their own costs of quarantine and/or testing.
- There are limited flights between Singapore and Manila currently.




Timor Leste Covid situation update as at 30 Oct 2020

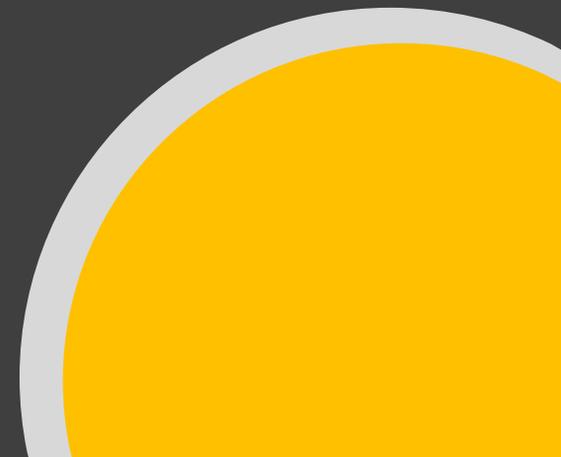
- The state of emergency was lifted and the country has reopened its international borders — including its land border with the Indonesian province of East Nusa Tenggara, with the proviso that there would be a two-week quarantine for incoming passengers
- Reconsider travel to Timor-Leste due to **COVID-19**. Exercise increased caution in Timor-Leste due to crime and civil unrest.
- No flights to Timor from Singapore are available.

Thailand Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 3,790

Deaths 59

- The Thai government has announced a State of Emergency effective until 30 November 2020. From 1 July 2020, most businesses and activities have resumed with social distancing and hygiene measures.
- Starting 1 October, visas will be open to foreign nationals traveling from countries with low or no local COVID-19 transmission. A limit of 300 tourists per week will be allowed in October.
- International arrivals will have to undergo mandatory quarantine for 14 days
- However, most businesses and activities have resumed with social distancing and hygiene measures.
- Business-people and technical experts from Singapore, are allowed to enter Thailand with 14 days quarantine.
- Limited Flights to Bangkok from Singapore.

Vietnam Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 1,204

Recovered 1,065

Death 35

- The Vietnam government has temporarily suspended entry of all foreigners and overseas Vietnamese via commercial flights into Vietnam.
- Only Vietnamese nationals, foreigners on diplomatic or official business, and highly skilled workers are allowed to enter Vietnam at this time. Anyone entering Vietnam will need to undergo medical checks and 14-day quarantine upon arrival.
- Vietnamese authorities will charge a quarantine fee for anyone entering Vietnam from September 1.
- All travellers entering Vietnam need to submit mandatory health declarations on arrival. Passengers are subject to medical screening and quarantine for 14 days at centralised facilities.
- No flights to Vietnam from Singapore are available.



Nepal Covid situation update as at 29 Oct 2020

Confirmed cases 176,000

Recovered 139,000

Deaths 984

- Nepal's biggest city of Kathmandu and its surrounding areas account for more than one-third of all infections, and authorities said cases were on the verge of slipping out of control.
- COVID-19 risk in Nepal is high. CDC recommends travelers avoid all nonessential international travel to Nepal.
- Nepal is still under lockdown. However, it is opening up to trekkers, but with strict measures. Visitors will need a negative Covid-19 PCR test within 72 hours of travelling. They will then have to quarantine in a hotel for seven days at their own expense. On day five, at the government's expense, they will have another test, and assuming that is negative they will be able to leave and continue with their plans on day seven.
- Flights to Nepal are available only to diplomats and VIPs.
- This does not apply to medical and repatriation flights.
- Passengers are subject to self-quarantine for 14 days.

Myanmar Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 55,809

Recovered 37,954

Deaths 1,306

- Myanmar has maintained lockdown measures in Yangon as covid numbers continue to escalate.
- The government of Myanmar has suspended all international commercial passenger flights until 30 November and all land borders are shut
- Arrivals must comply with Myanmar's COVID-19 quarantine requirements.
- Passengers are subject to quarantine for 14 days.
- Passengers must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) test result.
- This does not apply to nationals of Myanmar.

- COVID-19 risk in Cambodia is high. CDC recommends travelers avoid all nonessential international travel to Cambodia.
- Although Cambodia is not closed to tourists, there are limited flights from Singapore.
- Cambodia has imposed the following entry restrictions on all incoming travellers:
 - Passengers must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) test result issued at most 72 hours before arrival.
 - Passengers are subject to medical screening and quarantine for 14 days.



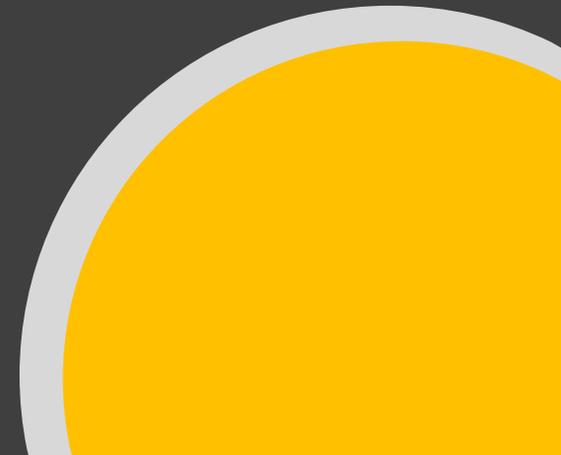

India Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 8,275,231

Recovered 7,540,000

Deaths 123,496

- There is a phased lifting of lockdown restrictions. This may vary by state. Lockdown restrictions remain in containment zones until 30 November.
- The Indian Ministry of Home Affairs has issued new guidelines to regulate activities in this period. Other restrictions vary between states and zones
- Despite escalating Covid infections in India, the government has eased restrictions and permitted states to open schools and movie theatres.
- In view of the ongoing
- COVID-19 situation, all regularly scheduled international flights remain suspended except for international repatriation flights.

Sri Lanka Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 11,732

Recovered 5,249

Deaths 22

- Colombo, Sri Lanka's capital, has gone back into lockdown from 30 Oct following a surge in coronavirus cases.
- Entry to Sri Lanka is currently prohibited for all foreign nationals, and tourist visas are not being issued for travelers.
- Arrivals must fill out a Health Declaration Form, take a PCR test on arrival and will have temperatures checked at the airport.
- 14-day quarantine is mandatory for all those travelling into Sri Lanka, followed by 14 days self-isolation at home
- Flights to Sri Lanka are still suspended.

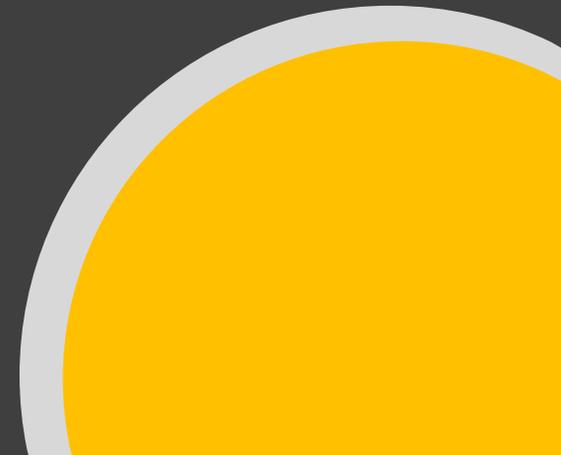


- Mongolia has lifted stay at home orders, and resumed in-country transportation options and business operations. However, Mongolia maintains an almost total ban on the entry of foreigners
- It has limited incoming air traffic to government-controlled charter flights.
- Passengers are subject to quarantine for 21 days at designated facilities. They are also subject to self-isolation for an additional 14 days.


- Entry ban implemented for travelers from most countries is still in place.
- However, The Reciprocal Green Lane for essential business and official travel between Singapore and Japan has been permitted since 18 September 2020.
- Travellers from Singapore must have been tested for Covid 19, 72 hours before departure and have a medical certificate to prove negative test result.
- All inbound travelers have to serve 14 days quarantine

Mainland China Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 86,119

- China has announced that it will temporarily suspend the entry into China by foreign nationals holding visas or residence permits still valid from the time of the announcement from 28 Mar.
- Singapore and China have launched a Fast Lane to facilitate essential business and official travel between both countries. Travellers may be subject to home or institutional quarantine for 14 days.


- Visitors are slowly being permitted to enter Taiwan for tourism and regular social visits.
- Upon entering Taiwan, all foreign nationals must present an English-language certificate of a negative COVID-19 test taken within three days of boarding the flight to Taiwan.
- After entry: all visitors must undergo a 14-day self-quarantine period.

Hong Kong Covid situation update as at 2 Nov 2020

Confirmed cases 5,343

Recovered 5,102

Deaths 105

- MOT announced on 15 Oct that Singapore and Hong Kong have reached an in-principle agreement to establish a bilateral air travel bubble, which will exempt travellers from quarantines or stay-home notices. Full details will be confirmed in the coming weeks.
- Those travelling under the bubble will have no restrictions on their travel purpose and will not need to have a controlled itinerary.
- However, travellers will need to test negative on mutually recognised COVID-19 polymerase chain reaction (PCR) tests. They will also be required to go on flights dedicated for those travelling under the bubble.
- If there is a spike in COVID-19 infection rates in Singapore or Hong Kong, the newly announced bilateral air travel bubble will be suspended.

Summary as at 02 November 2020

Based on the current spread of Covid 19 in the various regions, we have made the following observations:

1. In SEA, except for the spread flattening in Singapore and Timor Leste, infections in Malaysia and Indonesia are still on the increase, while in the Philippines it is spiking periodically.
2. In Indochina, the spread seems to be flattening in Thailand, Vietnam and Cambodia but still on the rise in Nepal and Myanmar.
3. In South Asia, the spread is still escalating in India, while in Sri Lanka, cases have begun spiking since 6 October.
4. In East Asia, the spread in Japan has been on the downward trend since end August although daily infections are still high. However, it seems to be flattening out in Mongolia, Taiwan, Hong Kong and China.
